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Our Preschool Day

Preschool hours are from 9:00-12:00.
Costs are as follows:

Young 3's

Two day (T, TH) \$ 190.00/month

3-year olds

Three day (M,W, F) \$315.00/month

Five day (M - F) \$415.00/month

4-year olds

Five day (M - F) \$415.00/month

VPK (M - F) Free

We do have an optional "Stay & Play" program on Mondays through Fridays from 12:00 noon to 2:00 pm. Sign ups are on a "first come, first serve" basis on the board in the main hallway. There is an \$8.00 charge per day.

The yearly registration fee for each student is \$100.00 payable upon registration and is non-refundable. The tuition is paid on a monthly basis and must be received prior to the first day of each month. VPK students have a \$100.00 registration donation that is due prior to the start of school.



Children must be toilet trained before the first day of school. Socks and close-toed shoes must be worn at all times.

We have one, three-year old class and two VPK classes. Each class has 12 students with two teachers in each.

A Lifetime of Learning

In our school we strive to provide an opportunity to discover they can enjoy school and accomplish great things. The Curriculum

The work of children is play. With that in mind, we use a developmentally appropriate teaching style. That means your child will have a chance to explore and experiment in a warm, loving atmosphere. Arts and crafts, stories, puzzles, music, dramatic play and hands-on projects are just a few of the ways we will stimulate your child's creativity and enthusiasm for learning. Each open-ended activity is geared to promote self-esteem and independent thinking.

Preventative Discipline

We practice preventative discipline. Children who are busy enjoying themselves are far less apt to have behavioral problems. Should a problem arise, it will be handled in a loving manner and the child will discuss the matter with the teacher.

Children in our school help to set the rules and discuss the consequences of negative choices. They learn very quickly that they can control the choices they make. Given that power, most children prefer to enjoy positive results.
